Recent Advances in Managing Acute Pancreatitis

Pancreatitis occurs when digestive enzymes become activated while still in the pancreas, irritating the cells of your pancreas and causing inflammation. With repeated bouts of acute pancreatitis, damage to the pancreas can occur and lead to chronic pancreatitis. Scar tissue may form in the pancreas, causing loss of function.

Acute pancreatitis represents a disorder characterized by acute necroinflammatory changes of the pancreas and is histologically characterized by acinar cell destruction.

Mechanisms and Management of Acute Pancreatitis

The acute pancreatitis (acute hemorrhagic pancreatic necrosis) is characterized by acute inflammation and necrosis of pancreas parenchyma, focal enzymic necrosis of pancreatic fat and vessel necrosis (hemorrhage). These are produced by intrapancreatic activation of pancreatic enzymes.

Acute pancreatitis is a common and usually self-limited illness resolving after a few days of rest and not eating. A minority of people develop severe pancreatitis with necrosis, which can transform pancreatitis into an ordeal lasting weeks or months, characterized by multi-organ failure, infections, and a >15% mortality rate.

Eating after Acute Pancreatitis

Acute recurrent pancreatitis (ARP) is defined as 2 distinct episodes of acute pancreatitis (AP), while chronic pancreatitis (CP) is caused by persistent inflammation of the pancreas. ARP and CP in children are caused by genetic mutations, autoimmune pancreatitis, congenital pancreatic abnormalities, and other conditions.

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
