Christopher Marlowe was probably born in 1563 or 1564, the son of a Kent shoemaker. The family were not well off: he attended King's School Canterbury on a scholarship and when he went to Corpus Christi College Cambridge in 1580 it was also on a scholarship, for students intending to study divinity.
