Structure, Sign, and Play in the Discourse of the Human Sciences was a lecture presented at Johns Hopkins University on 21 October 1966 by philosopher Jacques Derrida. The lecture was then published in 1967 as chapter ten of Writing and Difference. "Structure, Sign, and Play" identifies a tendency for philosophers to denounce each other for relying on problematic discourse, and argues that this reliance is to some degree inevitable because we can only write in the language we inherit. In the conclusion of his essay, Derrida observes that there are two ways to interpret structure, sign, and play. One seeks to decipher a truth or an origin, and avoids play. The other affirms play and tries to pass beyond man and humanism. The first way was dominant throughout human history.

With " Structure, Sign, and Play in the Discourse of the Human Sciences ", his contribution to a 1966 colloquium on structuralism at Johns Hopkins University, his work began to gain international prominence. At the same colloquium Derrida would meet Jacques Lacan and Paul de Man, the latter an important interlocutor in the years to come.

Derrida deduced that each sign performs two functions: 'differing' and 'deferring'. While one is spatial, the other is temporal. Coining the term 'sous rature' to express "the inadequacy of the sign", Jacques Derrida brings forth the notion that every sign is written under erasure.

The great influence of deconstruction may lie in its revolutionary explanation of the world, society, and the knowledge. Derrida claimed that deconstruction was not a theory or a method, but it has been turned into a theory and a method. At the root of this method is Derrida's concept of the reciprocity of signs.

He was given the honor to be the last speaker. Ironically, Derrida takes the advantage to declare the death of structuralism.

### The key ideas of Jacques Derrida in his essays "Structure ...

Working within the tradition of Western metaphysics (and particularly of linguistic systems), Jacques Derrida asserts in "Structure, Sign and Play in the Discourse of the Human Sciences" that any structure has always been neutralized by the process of giving it a center, or a fixed origin that serves to orient and balance the "totality" of that structure.
