The Spring Feasts. Passover (Pesach). Leviticus 23:5 specifies that the festival year begins with Passover on "the fourteenth day of the first month" (Nisan 15). Passover is the Feast of Salvation. In both testaments, the blood of the Lamb delivers from slavery – the Jew from Egypt, the Christian from sin.

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The word moadim in Hebrew is usually translated feast, but literally means "appointed times." The Jewish feasts were arranged in such a way as to remind the Jewish people of God and His ways, but to also point to a Messiah, a Savior. That promised One is Jesus. In Leviticus 23, God speaks to Moses about seven feasts.

How is the meaning of each of the Jewish feasts fulfilled ...

The first four feasts of the Bible, Passover through Shavuot, occur in the Spring. They typify our salvation in Messiah Yeshua (1 Corinthians 5:7). The number seven indicates completion. Hence the feasts of the seventh month are a prophetic picture of the Lord's final work of redemption in the final three feasts.

The Fall Feasts: The Prophetic Picture - Word of Messiah ...

Matzah (Unleavened Bread) (Leviticus 23:6) - Pointed to the Messiah's sinless life (as leaven is a picture of sin in the Bible), making Him the perfect sacrifice for our sins. Jesus' body was in the grave during the first days of this feast, like a kernel of wheat planted and waiting to burst forth as the bread of life.

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
