An expert witness, particularly in common law countries such as the United Kingdom, Australia, and the United States, is a person whose opinion by virtue of education, training, certification, skills or experience, is accepted by the judge as an expert. The judge may consider the witness's specialized opinion about evidence or about facts before the court within the expert's area of expertise, referred to as an "expert opinion". Expert witnesses may also deliver "expert evidence" within the area

An expert witness, or an opinion witness, is a person with specialized skill sets whose opinion may help a jury make sense of the factual evidence of a case. Expert witnesses testify as to their opinion about certain facts or events.

The primary duty of an expert witness is to the court; this overrides any obligation to the instructing and paying party or parties. Expert evidence should be independent, objective and unbiased. In particular, an expert witness must not be biased towards the party responsible for paying his fee.
