The Unfair Commercial Practices Directive 2005/29/EC regulates unfair business practices in EU law, as part of European consumer law. It requires corresponding laws to be passed that incorporate it into each member state's legal system.

Expected Revision Of The Unfair Commercial Practices ...

The Unfair Commercial Practices Directive was adopted in 2005 and fully harmonises unfair commercial practices law in Europe. It aims to achieve a high level of consumer protection, to smoothen the functioning of the internal market and to increase competition in the market as such.

The Unfair Commercial Practices Directive

By harmonising the EU's unfair trading laws, the new Unfair Commercial Practices Directive (the Directive) will clarify consumer rights and so facilitate cross-border trade; its ruling concept of 'maximum harmonisation' will in most cases also prevent Member States from applying provisions stricter than those required by the Directive.
